# **OLD BUSINESS:**

Remodel Classroom: Discussion continued from last month's meeting regarding classroom updates. Discussion focused on making updates that might provide much more "hands on" time for students. Students attending meeting felt that current curriculum was too focused on "book learning". Their hope was that classroom enhancements would address that concern and also provide incentives for students to enroll in Ag Ed. Discussion also touched on other ideas for improving overall enrollment.

<u>Ice Cream Booth at Mercer County Fair:</u> Mike Long attended and led an extensive discussion about the Ag Ed Boosters' involvement in the Mercer County Dairy's ice cream stand at the fair. The boosters agreed to be involved with staffing and at times bearing responsibility for the overall operation of the stand. Final outcomes were:

 Mike will change ice cream suppliers from Schwan's to Hershey's to lower costs and facilitate easier scooping. The quality of the product will remain at high traditional levels. Mike encouraged everyone to see for themselves by

- visiting the Girl Scout milkshake stand at the Country Fest. It will be serving Hershey's.
- Mike supplied a draft of the 2016 work schedule (attached) to cover the booth's operating hours. The boosters have a sizeable number of openings to fill and various methods of acquiring workers were discussed.
- An Ice Cream Stand Committee consisting of Kelly Schmitmeyer, Rebecca
  Ungruhn and Joe Meyer was selected to coordinate the project. They will
  work with Mike to solicit workers, determine who will be in charge of the stand
  on a daily basis and acquire signage reflecting the Boosters' involvement.
- Meeting attendees noted that most likely the best way to get workers was to directly call them. In the end the Ice Cream Committee is responsible for staffing of the open positions (see Mike's schedule) and the method of doing so is their call.
- Mike is open to hiring responsible outside organizations to cover shifts. This
  will of course reduce the Boosters' share of the proceeds.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

<u>Student Report:</u> Carly Ungruhn and Rachael Reichert have prepared a PowerPoint presentation emphasizing the positive aspects of Ag education. They will present this to 8<sup>th</sup> graders during the 2016 – 2017 school. Their goal is to attract additional enrollment.

The garden is planted. This year the students have included blueberry and blackberry bushes.

<u>Update to Board and Administration:</u> Prior to this evening's meeting Shawn Tuente and Rebecca Ungruhn met with the school board and administration. They presented a Marion Local Agricultural Science Update which was prepared by Mr. Elsass. (Copy attached) Per Shawn the update was well received.

  - The FFA made 40 fleece lap blankets for local nursing homes.
  - The FFA raised \$140 during FFA week to donate to a local family.
  - The community garden has been revamped to improve curb appeal, teach common gardening practices and include the chicken coops.
  - Ag Science students continued its educational visits to the elementary.
  - The 8th grade introduction to agriculture class was well received and has 24% increased enrollment for next year.
