MARION COMMUNITY UPDATE

AGRICULTURE: On October 21, a Grain Safety Demonstrations/Training session was held in the Homan Farms building in the Industrial Park. The Ohio State Ag Department, Local Fire Departments and the County Extension Office were all involved. The event went very well with many Ag students and local farmers attending.

In November, The Boosters attended a Greenhand and Chapter Degree Ceremony. These degrees are the entry level degrees in the FFA program. Booster member Terry Mescher addressed the group assuring them that the boosters will continue to support the program in any way they can.

At the December meeting, President Bart Homan led a discussion concerning the most effective approach to utilizing the scholarship and loan programs the boosters offer.

This fall, students from Marion Local's Ag Ed Program attended the National FFA Convention. Lauren Bruns received her American FFA Degree. She is the first ML student to receive this since the early 90's. Congratulations Lauren!

A couple of Ag Solutions initiatives are providing useful information regarding how crops absorb nutrients. The ADAPT program uses multiple soil and plant samples to scientifically determine the amount of nutrients being used. Many acres in the watershed are being studied. A new study focused primarily on phosphorous utilization will begin in the 2014 growing season. Glen Arnold, a manure applications specialist stationed in Putnam County, has a number of test plots which allow him to study the efficiency of applying liquid manure to growing crops. His trials reflect that this is a cost effective approach. The growing crops utilize the nutrients efficiently preventing them from entering the waterways.

COMMUNITY REPORT: The long talked about and awaited expansion of the Marion Industrial Park is reaching finalization. Pat & Nancy Nieberding have agreed to sell the required acreage, funding has been secured, tax deferments to cover infrastructure are in place and several potential tenants have come forward. Site preparation and infrastructure installation is scheduled for the spring of 2014. Many people worked creatively and diligently to make this happen. The recently completed income surveys reflect that the village of Chickasaw qualifies for grants to build a new water

plant. Al Lochtefeld, President of the Chickasaw Board of Public Affairs, is putting together a committee which will oversee the selection of a firm to build the facility. The MCDO will be involved since once completed water from the plant will be available to the broader community.

NKTelco has installed a communications building in Maria Stein and is installing infrastructure which will provide Chickasaw, Maria Stein and Osgood with state of the art, fiber optic phone, cable TV and internet service. Their General Manager, Preston Meyer informs us that his goal is to be providing service in the area by spring 2014.
