### MARION COMMUNITY UPDATE

<u>AGRICULTURE—ML Ag Ed:</u> The recently held State FFA Convention was attended by 27 Marion Local students. Many parents and members of the administration attended as well. Three students placed first in the Supervised Work Experience (SAE) competition. The Ag Ed Boosters are working with Ag coordinator Lucy Bambauer on a couple of projects. They are funding a gate to a garden the students are planting in land just south of the campus and they are assisting with Pork Stand staffing at the fair. The boosters also continue to investigate the feasibility of adding a greenhouse or building which would enhance the learning experience of several Ag classes. The students will be operating concession stands at a State Plowing Match which will be held at Kevin Homan's farm and at an upcoming Manure Field day being hosted by Mercer County Soil and Water.

<u>COMMUNITY REPORT – Industrial Park:</u> On April 17<sup>th</sup> the MCDO closed on a short term loan with the Osgood State bank. This loan provided funds to purchase 22.7 acres from Pat and Nancy Nieberding. The purchase was finalized on May 7. The division of the parcel into ten (10) industrial/business lots has been finalized. Jared Ebbing with Mercer County Development put together a financial package which will pay for the required infrastructure; site preparation, streets, and storm and sanitary sewer. A contract for this site work has been awarded to Saintignon Excavating Co. They plan to start by early July. On June 11, the MCDO closed on four (4) of the lots. Buyers were Elizabeth Huelsman, MTI Enterprises Limited and Dan Heitkamp. Signed agreements
