

<u>INDUSTRIAL PARK:</u> The continued building construction in the Industrial park is most gratifying. Several buildings are in various stages of completion. These businesses will provide excellent services to our area and increase our local commerce. We continue to be most grateful to the business owners who are committing their resources to this community.

<u>PRE SCHOOL:</u> The preschool classes conducted at Marion Local are totally funded by student tuition and fundraisers. This approach has kept the operation financially viable since its inception. Due to a number of factors it appears that keeping the school funded with desirable teacher/student ratios will be a challenge this year and going forward. The preschool board met on 11/23 to discuss the situation. ML superintendent Mike Pohlman joined part of the meeting and committed his and the school board's support. Thanks Mike. To ascertain the thoughts of the community, Maria Rethman, the preschool coordinator, will be sending out parent surveys after the first of the year. We encourage those receiving the survey to complete and return them. Your input will give us guidance as to how to continue to provide this most valuable service to our community. In the meantime the MCDO thanks Maria and her staff for the "labor of love" they unselfishly provide to our children.

AGRICULTURE: Since early 2011, the MCDO has been intensely involved in a Ag Solutions, a group that was formed to address the negative impact farming practices can have on the environmental health of Grand Lake St. Marys. A key goal of the group was to improve the lake while maintaining and even growing our farm economy. This is a big and important undertaking, one that has grown beyond me and the MCDO. I personally, and our organization, will be phasing out of our involvement in that effort. My concern with taking that step is that the mission of Ag Solutions will continue to be pursued. I've attended a couple of meetings recently with various stakeholders in this effort and I'm convinced that the work will continue.

<u>LEADERSHIP:</u> The MCDO started in the early 1990's with a ton of energy and vision. That early enthusiasm faded over the years and by 2007 the organization was barely surviving. That is not the case today, but we could use an energetic, visionary president. We need a person who cares deeply about this area and who has ideas about how the MCDO can help our community grow in positive directions. # Maria Stein Shrine of the Holy Relics— Don Rosenbeck

A Year of Reflection and Celebration: This new year of 2016 begins a year of reflection and celebration as we prepare to celebrate the 170<sup>th</sup> year of the Precious Blood Sister's locating in Maria Stein. On September 24, 1846 the Sisters moved into the newly erected Maria Stein Convent. Earlier in 1844, Fr. Brunner had brought Sisters, Priests, and Brothers to America to where convents were to be built close to parishes so the Sisters could pray for and minister to the German settlers of the area. Later in 1875, Father J.M. Gartner entrusted his collection of relics to the Sisters because of war and unrest in Europe. The Relic Chapel was built in 1892 to house the collection with the primary display of over 1000 relics in hand carved altars.


The Sisters of the Precious Blood have maintained the Maria Stein Shrine of the Holy Relics as a legacy to be shared with others both now and for future generations. On behalf of the staff and many volunteers at the Shrine, we welcome everyone to visit the Maria Stein Shrine and grounds to share in this year of reflection and celebration.
