Allergy Season

Seasonal allergies are those allergies that come with the change of seasons. Approximately two-thirds of spring allergy sufferers actually have year-round symptoms. These include a runny nose, coughing, sneezing, and/or itchy, watery eyes.

The most common seasonal allergy triggers include grass, pollen, and mold. Though these are triggers for symptoms, the actual cause of allergies lies within the immune system. It mistakes innocent things in the environment for a serious threat and attacks them, resulting in symptoms.

General suggestions to combat allergy symptoms include: staying inside when the pollen count is high, wash your hair before going to bed to rid your hair of trapped pollen, decrease stress (stress can increase your allergy response), keep the temperature in your house cooler to ward off dust mites, and wash bed sheets frequently and dry in the dryer to remove allergens.

Combating the symptoms often includes an antihistamine, but knowing your triggers is important to ensure you are taking the right precautionary and reactive measures. To do so, a visit to your doctor is a good place to start. They may refer you to see an allergist who will further investigate the cause and treatment regimen for your symptoms.

AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT

The Marion Local FFA Chapter held their annual FFA Banquet Tuesday, March 23rd, recognizing members for participation in FFA events and awards. The keynote speaker was Greg Homan, sharing insights on Marion Local graduates and the importance of the FFA. FFA members Gabe Bruns, Peyton Otte and Robby Buschur were recognized for earning their State

Degrees. Past members Ashley Bergman and Kelsey Broering were also recognized for becoming finalists for the American FFA Degree. Mrs. Bev Seger was recognized as an honorary member of the FFA chapter for her help yearly with many FFA activities. Members Owen Siefring, Libby Mescher, Robby Buschur, Kendra Wendel, and Hannah Meier were also recognized by Mr. Elsass as Star Chapter members. Lastly, the new 2021-2022 Marion Local FFA Officer team was installed.

The Ag Business class is completing 3 service-learning projects. One group held and coin drive to donate to Heifer International. The group raised over \$3000! Another group is installing birdhouses at our pollinator plot at Grand Lake St. Mary's and the last group is conducting a can drive for Rustic Hope in Russia, OH. These students develop a plan and goals to carry out these service projects.

We competed in the Dairy Cattle Evaluation and General Livestock contests in March. Most notably, the Dairy Evaluation team finished 12th among 90 teams from across the state. The dairy team was led by Zach Albers, Ben Knapke, Joe Kunk and Amber Wendel.

While the FFA State Convention is virtual this year, students will be participating at an event held at Marion Local High School. Along with watching sessions of the convention, students will also hear from various career/industry speakers and participate in a communications workshop.

Ag Solutions Update: The manure nutrient recovery project will start at Ivo Post's farm this week. It will take a couple of weeks to setup the equipment and work through any issues. Manure should be flowing by the end of April, and will continue for 5-6 months. A new wetland conservation area project is still on schedule for 2021 in the Grand Lake St. Mary's watershed. There is also a smaller project scheduled for Spring/Summer 2021 in the watershed as well. Research on the effectiveness of a saturated buffer practice installed in the Grand Lake watershed is ongoing and will continue for the next 2 years. Finally, they are continuing to work on a process that will hopefully be available for Mercer County that could be a real game-changer. Ag Solutions is planning to have an actual meeting again in the Summer 2021. More information to follow!

OLD BUSINESS:

MULTI-USE PATH

The Marion Community Greenway Project was able to complete a portion of the land acquisition. Construction is planned for 2021, and bid notification will be going out on March 18, 2021. The contract for seeding has been approved and hopefully will be complete by fall. Total cost of the project is estimated at \$1,175,000. The Ohio Public Works Commission' Clean Ohio Fund Green Space Conservation Program was awarded \$869,500 in grant funds in 2019. The committee had requested funding thru the 2021-2022 Ohio Capital Budget, which was recently approved and the Greenway Project will be awarded \$85,000. After the Ohio Capital Budget award is applied, the remaining balance needed for the project is \$39,886. The Committee is continuing the Founders Brick Club Pledges are still being accepted and details can be found at www.marioncommunities.com. This entire project would not be possible without the generosity and support of many organizations, businesses and people, all of which help make this community incredible!
